Middlemore Hospital:	4 patients: 3 with EMRSA-15 strain; 1 with AKh4 MRSA.
North Shore Hospital:	7 patients with AKh4 MRSA, 6 of whom were in Ward 8, Surgical; 6 staff with AKh4 MRSA in Ward 8, Surgical.
Auckland healthcare facilities †:	1 patient with EMRSA-15 strain.
Waikato Hospital:	1 patient with WR/AK1 strain.
Tauranga healthcare facilities †:	1 patient with EMRSA-15 strain.

Wanganui:	1 person with EMRSA-15 strain.
Manawatu:	1 healthcare worker from the UK with EMRSA-15 strain isolated during pre-employment screening.
Wellington:	3 people, including 2 with EMRSA-15 strain.

CURRENT OUTBREAKS OF NON-MULTIRESISTANT MRSA

Non-multiresistant EMRSA-15 (ciprofloxacin-resistant, erythromycin-susceptible) were newly isolated from 1 patient in Middlemore Hospital; 1 emergency department patient at North Shore Hospital; 1 patient in an Auckland healthcare facility †; 3 patients in Palmerston North Hospital - 1 in isolation after transfer from Hawkes Bay Hospital, 1 post-discharge from Starship Hospital, and 1 attending an outpatient clinic; 1 Wellington Hospital patient; 1 patient in isolation in Hutt Hospital after transfer from Wellington Hospital; 1 patient in Dunedin Hospital; and 1 Auckland community patient.

Of the two patients reported to be in Wanganui Hospital, one was in isolation and the other was a community patient receiving home healthcare.

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
